ANNUAL REVIEW 2016/17

In the past year, the Relationships Scotland Network has again provided face-to-face support to over 15,000 people across the country.

The Relationships Scotland Network is a unique Scotland-wide family and relationship support service. Our 22 Member Services help people cope with relationship problems, separation and divorce. We work with individuals, couples, families and children to help reduce conflict, improve communication and ensure that people are supported to manage times of crisis and relationship breakdown.

Our Network provides relationship counselling, family mediation, child contact centres and many other forms of related family support, including sexual relationship therapy, Parenting Apart Groups and children's counselling.

Our work has a strong focus on early intervention and prevention. We work with families as early as we can, supporting them to look at the issues they are facing and helping them avoid letting things get worse. Through our highly trained counsellors, mediators and other practitioners, we provide high quality and professional support services. Our work is supported by over 900 people, including around 400 volunteers.

A recent report by Inspiring Scotland (*Relationships Scotland, Cost Benefit Review, 2017*) has demonstrated the impact that our work has on the lives of children and families and the savings that this work has for the public purse. The report found that the average benefits to the public purse of successful relationship counselling, family mediation and child contact centres is estimated at £11,445, with an average delivery cost of £895.

When compared against the cost of delivery of such services, the average ratio of benefits to one pound of cost for relationship counselling is £11.20, family mediation £12.68 and child contact centres £14.94.

The work of the Relationships Scotland Network supports the Scottish Government's vision for children, young people and their families. We fully support the aspirations of the *National Parenting Strategy* and *The Early Years Framework*. Our work operates within the guiding principles of *Getting it Right for Every Child* (GIRFEC) and also supports the National Outcomes which underpin Single Outcome Agreements between the Scottish Government and every Local Authority in Scotland.

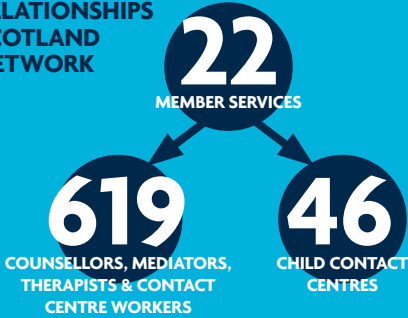
